

#### CHILDREN'S YOUTH COUNCIL VISIT

On Tuesday two of our Year 6 School Champions joined 35 other local Primary and Secondary schools at the Children's Youth Council.

Sessions included: An inspirational talk from Mr James Brent current Chairman of PAFC. Mr Brent talked about his life and how bringing PAFC into the community (raising £2 million per year for local projects) has been a highlight. He also talked to the children about the downside of social media and how his family have suffered from cyber



bullying. He gave words of advice about dealing with these issues and gave a question and answer session

Environmental issues: Councillor Darren talked about how our City Councill are planning to tackle the ever increasing problems of recycling and the disposing of single use plastics.

Helping Service Families MKC Heroes, RBL, RN/RM welfare and Councillor Pauline Murphy talked about how they help our service families.

## FLU VACCINATIONS—ELECTRONIC CONSENT

On **Wednesday 14th November** the Immunisation Team will be offering the Flu vaccination to all **Beechwood Primary Academy Children from Reception to Year 5.** This year the Immunisation Team are adopting electronic consent. In order to provide electronic consent for your child's Flu vaccination, please can we request that you access the consent portal via the following link below and follow instructions.

Please register your child as soon as possible. This is to ensure our nurses have sufficient time to clinically assess the information. This link is secure and unique to your child's school. Full details and information to assist you in completing the electronic consent is detailed on the consent portal including full FAQ's, patient information and contact details should you wish to speak to one of the school Immunisation Nurses regarding the nasal vaccination.
