I like holding the flag at breaktimes because it will help us win the prize - Bella



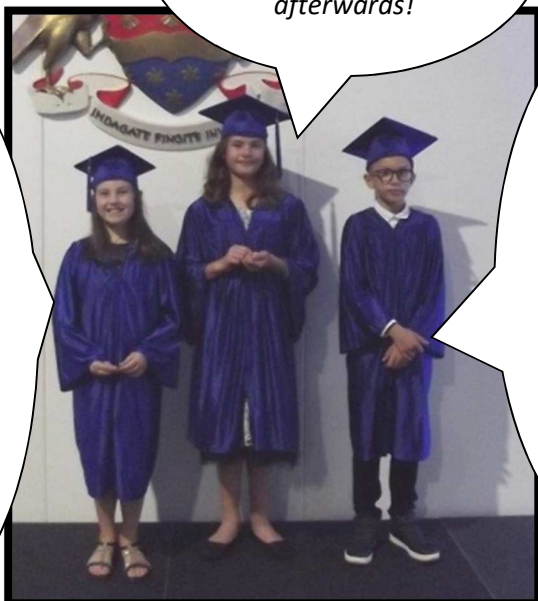
