JUNIOR FIELD GUN RUNNING CLUB AT BEECHWOOD AND WESTON MILL



Weston Mill and Beechwood Primary Academies have launched their Junior Field Gun Running clubs this term. The clubs are hoping to support Armed Forces day in June, after receiving their wooden field guns from the Devonport Field Gun Association. Mrs Dibben, Head of School at Weston Mill, told the Herald:

"As a newly formed academy with Beechwood and Oakwood, this was something that was introduced to us by Mrs Evans, Head of School at Beechwood, and something we are keen to roll out across

Discovery MAT. Support from our staff will enable this to happen and we look forward to developing this with the children over the forthcoming year."

The Devonport Field Gun Association is passing that tradition on to new generations by manufacturing wooden gun replicas for school pupils to compete with.

Dave Worrall, chairman of the Association commented: "We'd like to bring field-gunning back in schools. There are lots of field guns in schools all over the country, but they're often made of car tyres, and parts of lampposts – it's not been standardised and children have never had a set field gun run.

"We are going to standardise it. We have a drill to go with it, health and safety risk assessments, we've got everything."

Plymouth has been a spiritual home for the field gun since 1907 when the first tournament began in London between Portsmouth, Devonport and Chatham.
