PARENT UPDATE

What a lovely, sunny, but very cold week last week! Please remember to send children into school with coats, it is extremely cold outside but lovely to have such dry weather.

We have had a very exciting week; the minibus has been very busy travelling to the Eden Project all week with the Year 6 children who have had an amazing learning experience that links perfectly with their topic. The Y3 children also visited The Soapbox in Devonport Park and watched a show, including finding out about the puppets they will be making. Some of the Year 3 and 4 children have been to Sir John Hunt for a sports festival and really enjoyed their time together. All of the children have been fantastic ambassadors for the school, enjoying their learning and experiences whilst remembering to show their fantastic manners and interest with others. I am always proud of our children, and it is important to me that the children are recognized for this in other areas of school life, especially when out in public.

This term we have been focusing particularly on the STEM skills in class and through our learning, the children have loved using these to find out more about the way they learn. I am also delighted that they have been so proactive in recognising when these skills are used in learning. We have also focused on Reading Comprehension and the children are really beginning to show their skills in this area, being part of Reading Clubs and the focus on Reading Comprehension in class has really allowed them to show how the understand texts and reading and develop a broad vocabulary. We have also been focusing on attendance, with rewards and stickers and supporting children to be in school each day. Next week we will celebrate attendance in assembly.

Mrs Oliver is running a Solihull Approach workshop for parents starting after Easter. Many of you will have heard about this, it is one of the best courses in the UK that focuses on relationships between adults and children and develops skills and knowledge to support your child from their youngest years to teenager and beyond. It supports all aspects of relationships with children and it is so important that the teachers and staff at Beechwood will be receiving the Solihull Approach training later in the year. It is important to us that we learn from the course to support the children in our care, whether or not we have our own children and I am delighted that the teachers have requested to be part of the course so they can further their understanding in this area. If you would like any information, please ask your class teacher.

On Tuesday, we have a non-uniform day to raise some donations for the humanitarian response in Ukraine. We will be sending the money raised to the Disasters Emergency Committee, who will distribute funds to charities working in Ukraine. Please do wear your school uniform to school if you do not wish to donate.

On Thursday Year 1 will be performing their Easter production to the school and their parents in the afternoon at 2.45pm. These children did not have a Reception Christmas Production last year as restrictions were in place, so the children are together for an Easter production instead. We are really looking forward to seeing what they have been doing, as is the tradition, the children are very excitedly keeping their production a secret until the unveiling on Thursday. If you are a parent or carer of a Year 1 child, we welcome you to school at 2.45pm, please enter through the dining hall.

PARENT UPDATE

Next week, Year 5 are out for a visit to the Incinerator to complement their recent work on waste, particularly food waste. This is an exciting opportunity and I look forward to finding out what they learn. On Thursday, school reports will be coming home to parents and we will also be sending a special newsletter with a Celebration of Learning for the school from this term, as well as the winners from the fantastic Easter competition.

This week we will be saying goodbye to Mrs Wilkins and Miss Davis . They will be leaving us to take on exciting new ventures. We wish them both good luck for the future and thank them for all the support they have given during their time at Beechwood.


For children:

Children and young people with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education setting. Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. They can go back to school, college or childcare, and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough to attend.

We really feel that there could be some future explorers in year two!





Where does it come from?

The Solihull Approach was first developed in Solihull in 1996 by Health Visitors and Psychotherapists working with families whose children were having feeding, sleeping, toileting and/or had behaviour difficulties. It has since been developed further and is now used by a wide range of professionals from different agencies who work with families. The Solihull Approach Model provides a framework for thinking about children's behaviour





Key Facts

- Open to parents of children aged 0-16.
- 10 week course, 2 hours a week, term time only.
- Focus on building a positive relationship between parents and children.
- Open to all parents regardless of their situation who want to look at building or maintaining good relationships within the family.

The Solihull Approach Parenting Programme

The programme is based on the Solihull Approach to parenting and focuses on the parent/child relationship.

It aims to support parents in building positive and responsive relationships with their children.
