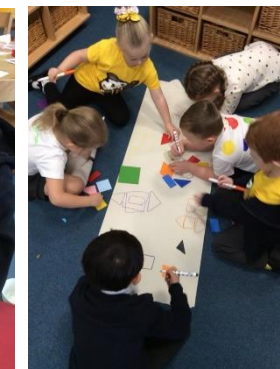
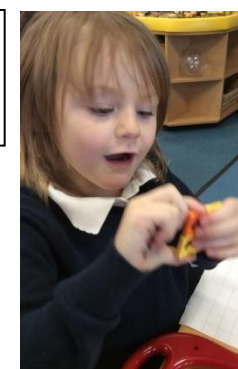
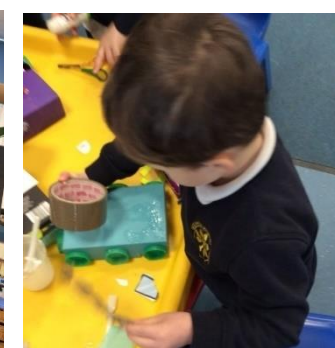

Autumn Term Summary

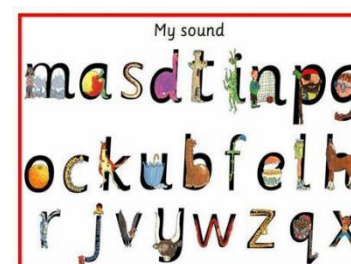
Weather Watchers



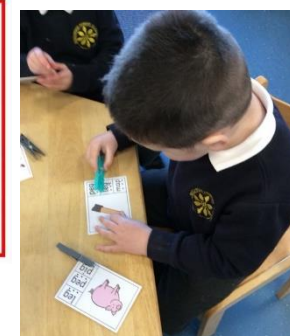
We have explored and used a range of artistic effects to express ourselves (technique, colour, texture, design, collage).

We have played lots of Circle Time activity games focusing on feelings. We have used the 'Mood Monsters' to help us identify and talk about our feelings.



We have enjoyed learning about the Christmas Story through practicing the Nativity. We have learnt new songs and actions.
