PARENT UPDATE



Thank you for your support for Children In Need this year. Plymouth charities are often beneficiaries of money from Child in Need so it is a fantastic charity for us to support. We really appreciate your donations and the children had a lovely time.

Year 1 had a great trip to Pizza Express as part of their topic and they had a great time experiencing how to make pizza and learning from a chef. Thank you to their teachers who organised and helped them on this trip.





Last week, we also focused on Anti-Bullying week. The children took part in different activities exploring kind behaviour and thinking about the impact of unkind behaviour.

We also explored that it is never ok to be unkind and that bullying is if someone is unkind to the same person over a long period of time, which also is not ok. We reminded children about how to be kind, things to say as part of our everyday focus on kindness and recognition for this and we explored different ways to help each other be kind, as well as what to do if someone is being unkind.

We never condone unkindness in any form and we help children to understand the impact of being unkind and how to make it better. This is an important social development and it is also important that children experience kindness in all areas of their life as well as understanding that the first part of making things better is to say sorry.

Children have also worked on online safety and the links with kindness when it feels like you are protected by not being directly with other people, a key area of learning in a world full of connected technology.

We are part of the National Online Safety programme which supports our teaching and learning, and has constantly updated resources to ensure that our information and support is as up to date as possible. This week, there is a non-pupil day on Friday, as staff take part in the next part of RWI (Read, Write Inc) professional development. This is part of our whole school focus to ensure that early reading develops



the skills needed for life-long, fluent readers a well as making sure that all teachers and staff across the school are confident in the structures of teaching phonics reading.

On Thursday, the children are welcome to come to school in non-school uniform to bring in an item for their stall at the school Winter Fayre which is in Christmas week on Wednesday 14th December from 3.15pm-5.00pm, organised by our wonderful PTFA. Who are we? We are a team of researchers, dentists and community engagement experts from the University of Psymbiath and the Peninsula Dental Social Enterprise

Why are we doing this research? Caring for your teeth can be difficult. For auditic disliders and assuing people there may be additional chellenges. We know that auditic children and young people often have high levels of untreasted point decay and good diseases and are more likely to have teeth taken out under general share(but).

What do we want to do? We want to understand from aussticithieron, young people and those that care for them what inhances have they look after their teeth and wicess dental care. The research will be used to inform the development of dental care services for aussticithiero and young people in Phymotha and beyond.

How are we doing 3? We would like to talk to substit children and young people about looking after their teerth and going to the dentits. We would also like to speak to the parents and carers of authoric children and young people about timbe issues. You are invited to take partifyou, your child or the child you care for its:




IMPORTANT INFORMATION


Year 3 have loved learning about dinosaurs so far this term!



Year 5 – Wrapped hard boiled sweets (eg humbugs, eclairs)


Year 6 – Un opened soft drink bottles (eg coke, orange juice)

The PTFA would also welcome any good quality, nearly new toys or gifts for their gift stall and donations of chocolate or sweets.






The i-THRIVE Framework

The Children and Young People's Speech and Language Therapy Service is provided according to the i-THRIVE framework. This promotes prevention and early help for speech, language and communication needs. See our website for more information on the i-Thrive framework.



Parent/Carer Training



As part of our 'Getting Help' offer we deliver a range of virtual training sessions for perents and carers. You may be invited to book on to a session following a Request for Help call, or offered a space whilst your child is on the waiting list or on a caseload.

The training sessions are delivered by Speech and Language Therapists to small groups on Microsoft Teams. There will be some information and ideas from us on each topic and there may be an opportunity to share strategies that have worked for you at home.

Sessions Available

'Attention Builders' will look at developing attention skills to support young children's communication.

'Signing to develop Speech, Language and Communication' explores why we sign and provides the chance to learn and practice a selection of everyday early language signs to get you and your child started.

"Speech and Cued Articulation" will talk about typical, delayed, and disordered speech sound development. You will learn about some strategies to support speech sounds, including Cued Articulation. There is also a video of Cued Articulation actions available on our webpage.

'Stammering' will discuss the causes of stammering and how you can best support your child at home. There will also be time to share your concerns and experiences. This session is aimed at parents/carers of children of preschool or primary age.



The sessions are run on a rolling programme with each topic being covered once every six weeks. The sessions last either an hour or an hour and a half depending on the topic.

Budgeting/finance and energy workshops

This is a new government initiative that is helping people to become more confident using maths in everyday life.

The workshops will be about sharing of ideas and how to use technology and maths to help you in your everyday life.

We will look at finance and what it means to you and various options that are available. It will link in with budgeting and energy, including use of the smart meter and how to calculate your energy usage, how to save energy and what items cost more to run, best buys in supermarkets and money saving apps, meal planning and sharing ideas to help one another.

This will be run over two consecutive weeks and will be led by the needs of the group and what they would like out of it.

There are several workshops that the government are providing so we will be looking for your feedback on what courses would be beneficial to the Beechwood Families.
