



In Literacy, we read the story 'Little Red Riding Hood', created a story mountain, and acted it out.

We discussed how the characters feel in our favourite fairy tales. We started off with recapping feelings. We could already identify a lot, including sad, happy, angry, worried, anxious, scared, frightened, excited, and tired. We also learnt some new vocabulary: joyful, cheerful, frustrated, confused and energetic.

We then looked at pictures of characters from a variety of fairy tales, such as, Little Red Riding Hood, Big Bad Wolf and Snow White. We observed the pictures closely and suggested how we think they might feel and why. Finally, we collaborated and created posters of fairy-tale characters and wrote words for how we think they feel for the classroom display.

We learnt all about minibeasts! First, we talked about the different types of habitats

around the world. Then, we discussed 'micro-habitats'. A micro-habitat will differ from the larger environment around it, making it particularly suited to one or more species. We predicted which micro-habitat would suit some of our favourite minibeasts.

We took our learning outside and went on a minibeast hunt around the school grounds. We identified lots of different microhabitats, including, logs, rocks, soil, bushes, trees, leaves, grass, flowers, and pond. We found a variety of minibeasts, such as, flies, ants, millipedes, woodlouse's, worms, snails, earwigs, spiders, and slugs.











