IMPORTANT NOTICE TO PARENTS FREE SCHOOL MEAL CRITERIA



You may be entitled to apply for your child/ren if you receive Universal Credit, Income Support, Income based Job Seekers Allowance, Income related Element of Employment and Support Allowance, Guaranteed Credit element of Pension Credit or Child Tax Credit (working Tax Credit) with an annual income of £16,190 or less.

We would urge parents who may be eligible for Free School Meals for their children to complete an on-line application form on Plymouth City Council's website or contact the school office for a form as soon as possible.

This is very important, even if your child does not wish to take up the free meal. The register of FSM entitlement affects our overall school budget and we may be missing out on funding as a result.

Please do not confuse this with Universal Free School Meal entitlement for children in Years Reception to Year Two.

For children already in receipt of Free School Meals, please continue to collect your food hamper from school every **Wednesday between 1.30 and 2.30pm**. It is important that you please call the school office if your situation changes and you no longer require your hamper, so that your order can be cancelled in advance. Thank you.

Here is Liam's menu.






The Educare children had a visit from a Roman Soldier! They called him Swarmus Maximus! Here is Alfie's labelled Roman soldier. Do you think they look alike?








This week Year 1 have learnt new sounds. They have been learning about speech marks and question marks.









