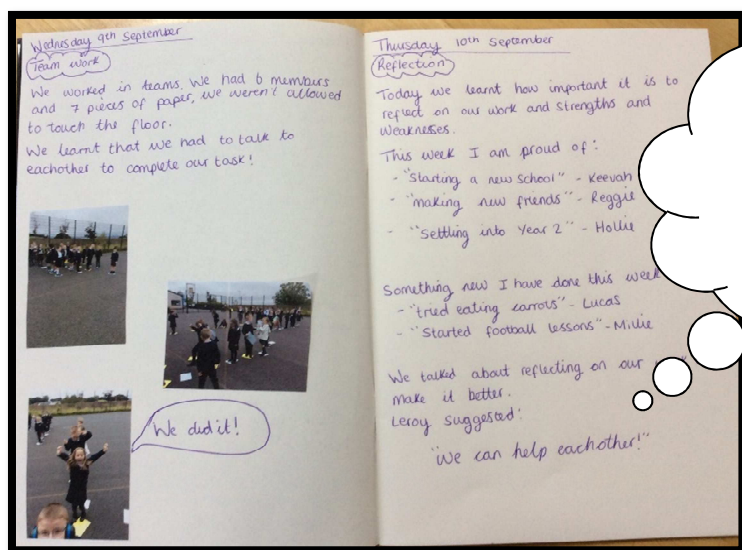


Welcome Back! PSHE and Safety Weeks at Beechwood.

'In PSHE we have been learning about nature and taking care of it. I have enjoyed making a buzzy bee!' – Maddison

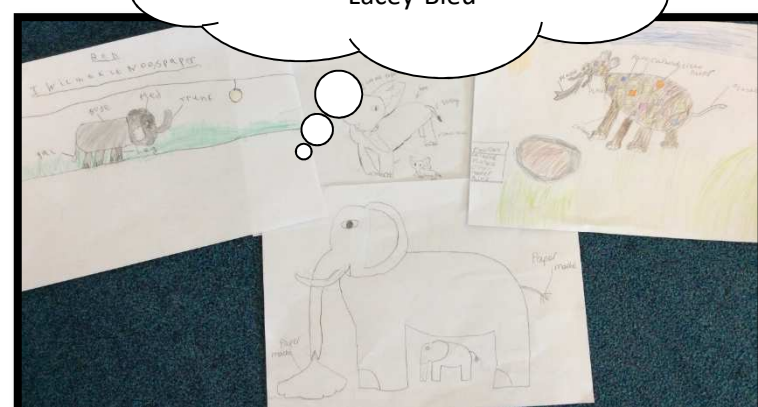
'It is important to be independent so we can have good jobs when we grow up' – Jorgie

During the PSHE and Safety Week, **Wisdom class, Year 6**, explored many ways in which they can stay safe both in school and at home. The children explored and evidenced what it means to be Ready, Respectful and Safe at school and when socialising with people in the local community. We discussed all the different means of communications both online and offline and how we should always ensure we know who we are contacting and conduct ourselves sensibly. Children identified what actions they would need to take if online relationships weren't safe so that they could keep themselves safe. They have also practised their own safety in school by using and remembering 'Hands, Face, Space' when in class and moving around our school.

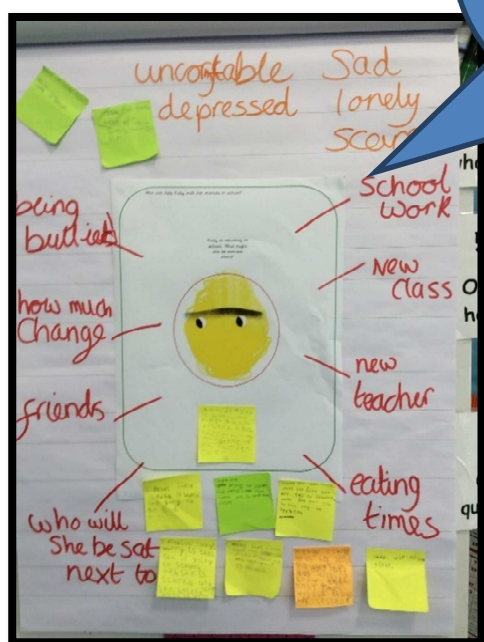
